Problem 2 (34 points)

A particle is moving in three dimensions. Its position vector is given by:

$$r = 6\hat{x} + (3 + 4t)\hat{y} - (3 + 2t - t^2)\hat{z}$$
.

Distances are in meters, and the time, t, in seconds.

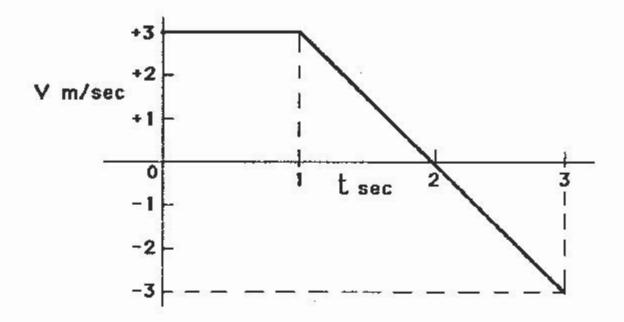
- a) (6) What is the velocity vector at t = +3?
- b) (6) What is the speed (in m/sec) at t = +3?
- c) (6) What is the acceleration vector and what is its magnitude (in m/sec²) at t = +3?

Now the particle is moving only along the z-axis, and its position is given by $(t^2 - 2t - 3)\hat{z}$.

- d) (6) At what time does the particle stand still?
- e) (10) Make a plot (a sketch) of z versus time covering t = -2 to +4 sec.

Problem 3 (44 points)

A particle moves along a straight line, x. At time t = 0, its position is at x = 0. The velocity, V, of the object changes as a function of time, t, as indicated in the figure; t is in seconds, V in m/sec and x in meters.



- a) (6) What is x at t = 1 sec?
- b) (6) What is the acceleration (in m/sec²) at t = 2 sec?
- c) (6) What is x at t = 3 sec?
- d) (6) What is the average velocity (in m/sec) between t = 0 and t = 3 sec?
- e) (10) What is the average speed (in m/sec) between t = 0 and t = 3 sec?
- f) (10) Make a plot (a sketch) of x versus time between t = 0 and t = 3 sec. Indicate clearly in your plot at t = 0, 1, 2, 3 sec what exactly the x positions are (be quantitative).

Problem 2 34 points

6 pts a)
$$\vec{v} = \frac{d\vec{r}}{dt} = 4\hat{y} - (2 - 2t)\hat{z}$$

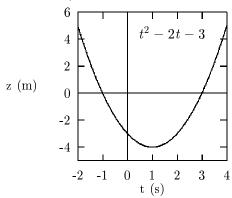
at $t = 3$, $\vec{v} = 4\hat{y} + 4\hat{z}$

6 pts b)
$$|\vec{v}| = \sqrt{16 + 16} = 4\sqrt{2} \text{ m/sec}$$

6 pts c)
$$\vec{a} = 2\hat{z}, |\vec{a}| = 2 \text{ m/sec}$$

6 pts d)
$$v = (2t - 2)\hat{z} \Rightarrow v = 0$$
 when $t = 1$ sec

10 pts **e)**
$$z = t^2 - 2t - 3$$
, at $t = 0$, $z = -3$
 $z = 0 \rightarrow t = \frac{+2 \pm \sqrt{4 + 12}}{2} = 1 \pm 2 \Rightarrow t = -1$ and $t = +3$
 $v = 0$ at $t = 1 \Rightarrow z = 1 - 2 - 3 = -4$
at $t = -2$, $z = 4 + 4 - 3 = +5$



Problem 3 44 points

6 pts a) $x = x_0 + v_0 t = 3t$ and at t = 1, x = +3m

6 pts b) $a = \frac{dv}{dt}$ and a is constant between t = 1 and t = 3. The velocity goes down by 6 m/sec in 2 sec. Thus, a = -3 m/sec².

6 pts c) At the beginning of the 2nd sec, x = +3 and v = +3. During the next 2 sec (up to t = +3), a = -3. Thus x at t = 3 becomes $x = +3 + 3t - \frac{3}{2}t^2$. But t is now 2 sec so x = +3 m.

6 pts d) $\bar{v}_{t=0,t=3} = \frac{x_3-x_0}{3} = \frac{\pm 3-0}{3} = +1$ m/sec

10 pts e) Between t=1 sec and t=2 sec, the position of x keeps increasing as the velocity is positive. x reaches a maximum at t=2 sec, at which time its position is x=+4.5 m. During the third second (between t=2 sec and t=3 sec), the velocity becomes negative and at t=3 sec the object is back at x=+3. Thus, it has traveled 4.5+1.5=6 m during the first 3 sec. Thus its average speed is 2 m/sec.
