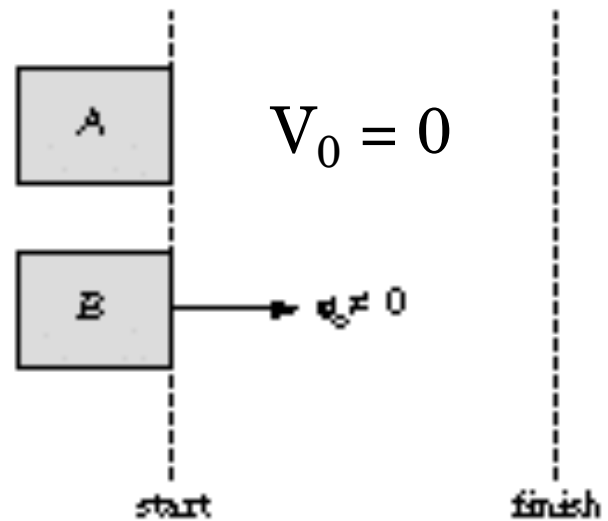


Two objects (labeled A & B) collide.
Newton's 3rd law tells us that the force A exerts on B must be equal and opposite to the force B exerts on A. Which of the following is true:

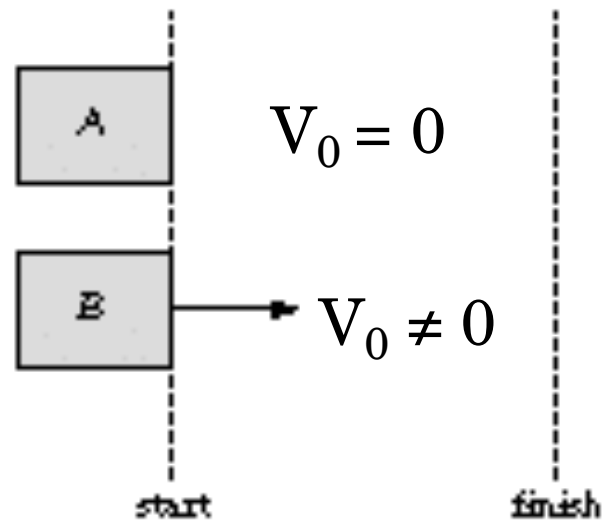
- 1) The change in momentum of A due to the force between the objects must be equal and opposite of the change in momentum of B.
